Zygmunt Vetulani (born 1950) is a full professor in computer sciences. He holds a position (profesor zwyczajny) at the Adam Mickiewicz University (UAM) in Poznań (Poland) where he is (since 1996) the head Department of Computer Linguistics and Artificial Intelligence. He is also full time professor at the Technical University of Koszalin (Poland). He studied mathematics (1973, M.Sc.) and French Philology (1982, M.A.). He has got his PhD in mathematics from Warsaw University (1977) and habilitation in computer linguistics from UAM (1990). Professor title since 2006.

Alexander von Humboldt Foundation fellow in 1987-1989.

His main research activities during the last 20 years are in the field of computer understanding natural language and related topics. Author (or co-author) of 5 books and over 90 research contributions in computer science, mathematical logic and linguistics (systems with language competence system POLINT understanding written Polish /, electronic morphological dictionary /POLEX/, PolNet-Polish wordnet project). He participated in several European and national research projects. Since 2006 actively contributes to the Polish Platform for Homeland Security (project on "Text processing technologies for Polish in application for public security purposes" (project manager)). Since 1994 served at several occasions the European Commission as expert in the field of human language technologies. He was the chair and the main organizer of Language and Technology Conferences (Poznań, Poland) in (1995, 2005, 2007, 2009, 2011).
